Guidelines for Abstract Submission (oral/poster presentation)

Abstract submissions are invited by the following groups:

- 1. Researchers post Masters and/or currently undertaking a PhD
- 2. Post-Doctoral Researchers
- 3. Registrars
- 4. Trainee Psychologists

Abstracts should be structured according to the following headings:

- o Objectives
- o Methods
- Results
- Conclusions
- The abstract title should contain no more than 20 words, and should be entered in the title field
- > The abstract text should include no more than 350 words
- > References should not be used unless particularly useful for clarification
- > Personal contact details etc. are not permitted in the abstract text

Duration: Standard oral presentations will be 15 minutes (12mins talk + 3mins questions)
